



## New Family Planning and Healthy Texas Women Programs

On **July 1, 2016**, Texas Health and Human Services Commission will launch two new women's health programs: Healthy Texas Women and a new Family Planning program. The Texas Women's Health Program and the Expanded Primary Health Care Program will be consolidated into Healthy Texas Women, and the new Family Planning Program will be a modified version of the state's current Family Planning program. Participation is needed from family physicians, hospitals, federally qualified health centers, and specialized family planning clinics. These programs are still being developed; current information as of May 16, 2016 is included in the table.
