

Family Planning Program (FPP)

What is the Family Planning Program (FPP)?

The Family Planning Program is a General Revenue-funded, limited-benefit program that serves uninsured men and women across Texas.

Services covered include:

- Birth control
- Cancer screenings
- Chronic disease testing & treatment

Vital healthcare source for under-resourced Texans:

- Approximately 146,000 women received services through FPP. (A 27.44% increase from FY 2023.)
- FPP operated through 225 active healthcare providers.

Program Stabilization:

- The 88th legislature made huge investments in this program to stabilize providers who were consistently exceeding their contracts and absorbing costs.
- Their investments significantly reduced FPP provider "funds gone" claims. In FY 2024, FPP funds gone claims totaled \$874,425, a 59.19 % decrease from FY 2023.

> Future Needs:

- There is a shortage of providers, particularly in West Texas & the Panhandle.
- Only 19 patients in the Northwest Texas region, and only 41 patients in the West Texas region, received services through FPP in FY 2024. (For comparison, FPP served 5,531 patients in the Metroplex region.)
